1. Introduction of the COMENTH Project

Collaboration in higher education Mental Health (COMENTH) is a collaborative NORPART project between Norway and Nepal with University of Oslo and Tribhuvan University as the main partners. University of Bergen and University of Tromsø are other academic partners from Norway together with several other non-academic partners from Nepal and Norway. The main aim of the project is to strengthen academic collaborations

at master and PhD levels through joint courses, exchange of faculties and students, study visits by high level officials, and collaboration in research.
